Neurodevelopmental disorders are a group of disorders that are typically diagnosed during childhood and are characterized by developmental deficits in personal, social, academic, and intellectual realms; these disorders include attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and autism spectrum disorder. ADHD is characterized by a pervasive pattern of inattention and/or hyperactive and impulsive behavior that interferes with normal functioning.

A clinical child psychologist is a type of professional psychologist who studies the cognitive, social and emotional development of children. Typically, child psychologists look at development from the prenatal period through adolescence. Some of the traditional areas of interest include genetics, language development, learning disabilities, personality, gender roles, cognitive development, sexual development and social growth.

Today's approach to children's behavior is based on child-centered approaches. The current DSM IV contains more than two-dozen Axis I disorders specific to children. Also, the American Psychological Association's division 12 (Clinical Psychology) has two sects devoted to children. A newer field of expertise, Developmental Psychopathology has come about focused on studying childhood disorders from a more developmental perspective (Nietzel et al. 1998).
