However, it is also well-established that knowledge of a second language impacts the ability to manage information in the native language (e.g., Marian & Spivey, 2003), and current cognitive and psycholinguistic models of bilingualism explicitly posit that the two languages interact, even during language-specific processing (e.g., Costa, Caramazza, & Sebastian-Galles, 2000; Dijkstra & Van Heuven, 2002).

Because cues that signal the beginning and ending of words can differ from language to language, a person's native language can provide misleading information when learning to segment a second language into words.

In the first half of the 20th century, the prevailing view was that bilingualism and second-language acquisition early in life made children confused and interfered with their ability to develop normal cognitive functions 1 and succeed in educational environments. 2 These ideas were dramatically reversed in a landmark study by Peal and Lambert 3 that showed a general superiority of bilinguals over monolinguals in a wide range of intelligence tests and aspects of school achievement.

7 Quirky Side Effects of Learning a Foreign Language

The learners more successfully counted phonemes in L2 words with consistent letter-phoneme correspondences (e.g., *acé /fəʒ/*, three letters/three phonemes) than in words with inconsistent correspondences (e.g., *звать /zvatʲ/*, five letters/four phonemes), indicating that L2 phoneme awareness is influenced by L2 orthography and that orthographic effects are not limited to the L1.
